Graduate programs in liberal studies have grown in popularity over the last few decades. In contrast to traditional subject-specific graduate programs, the interdisciplinary approach of the Master of Arts in Liberal Studies (MALS) program reaches across the arbitrary boundaries of specialization, drawing upon a broad range of knowledge to provide a well-rounded educational experience.

MALS is a non-traditional graduate program that allows students to design their own individualized course of study through evening, online, and summer classes. The program is taught by tenured professors and renowned scholars from the graduate faculty of the College of Arts and Sciences in our quaint private university setting that is nestled in beautiful Coral Gables.













The Flexibility to Explore

MALS is designed to allow students from any academic background to develop the critical insight and creative energy to be successful in any chosen career, providing unique and valuable insights into the human condition.

Coursework is offered in the evenings, during the summer, and online, allowing each student to craft an individualized plan of study that accommodates their schedule and satisfies their interests.

The result is a life-changing educational experience. Students are able to personalize their graduate experience under the mentorship

of UM's top faculty, choosing among electives that range in topic from medical humanities to medieval literature, from race relations to religious studies, from classics to climate change. Additionally, MALS students have the freedom to take courses at other UM schools and colleges, engage in experiential learning opportunities, participate in civic engagement projects, or complete an internship.

The MALS journey is one that gives you the opportunity for intellectual and personal growth, as well as an outlet for sharing your experiences with others through a robust and diverse community of learners.











FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

The MALS program has a limited number of tuition waivers available to students on a first-come, first-served basis. Students must apply each semester and provide financial documentation, as waivers are need-based.



CERTIFICATE IN LIBERAL STUDIES

The Certificate in Liberal Studies is ideal for someone who followed a more structured pathway in their undergraduate career and would now like to pursue a credential that highlights their creativity, communication ability, and cultural awareness. Certificate students come from a variety of backgrounds, including business, engineering, medicine, law, and teaching. The certificate requires 15 graduate credits that can be transfered into the MALS program.
